

"The World of Laura Ingalls Wilder" the Frontier Landscapes that Inspired the Author of the Little House Series



Marta McDowell, horticulturalist, historian and noted author will entertain us as we explore the natural history, places, and plants from the 1860s which are inspiring the new prairie garden and native plant movement. No place else on earth has such an extreme continental climate as the heartland of North America, yet it is a place filled with plants of every size and hue. The Midwest is the Epicenter of the Native Plant Movement in the United States. Laura Ingalls Wilder's Little House series chronicled frontier life starting in the late 1860s. The World of Laura Ingalls Wilder, a world of prairie, forest, farm and garden illuminates our own relationship to nature.

Marta teaches landscape history and horticulture at the New York Botanical Garden where she has been twice awarded "Instructor of the Year." A popular lecturer, she has been a featured speaker at locations ranging from the Philadelphia Flower Show to the Sloane Club in London.



Marta interned at Wave Hill, Bronx NY, Frelinghuysen Arboretum, Morristown NJ, and the Royal Horticultural Society's Rosemoor in Devon, England and at the Chelsea Physic Garden in London. She worked as a horticulturist for five years at Reeves-Reed Arboretum, Summit NJ. Marta is on the Board of the NJ Historical Garden Foundation at the Cross Estate in Bernardsville, NJ. Her particular interest is in authors and their gardens, the connection between the pen and the trowel.
